THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Genesis 18:20-33

In this account of Abraham persisting in prayer for his neighbor, we do not see a child of God praying in his own self-interest, but for the mercy of God upon others. In this we see how the heart of Christ lives within the child of God. We also should pray earnestly and with persistence for the lost sinners of this world that they might be spared from the wrath to come, and come to repentance and righteousness through faith in Christ Jesus.

THE DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

Holy Communion is the most tremendous spiritual tranquilizer there is. It brings us spiritual tranquility despite our sins, and lets us face our Maker peacefully. Unfortunately, some people are already so tranquil they are practically spiritually asleep, as 1 Corinthians 11:27-30 says. The church is not doing people a favor if it serves communion to anyone who wants it, anymore than a doctor would be by handing out Valium to anyone who asked for it. Used incorrectly, Valium may put you to sleep permanently! So may communion put one to sleep spiritually- if used improperly. That is one reason our church practices "close communion," Taking care that those who participate in the Lord's Supper are properly prepared to do so.
