### THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Isaiah 52:13-53:3

Isaiah in this precious prophesy lays out for us the hidden facts of our salvation. Jesus went forward into His passion as the Servant of the Lord. He would be "marred more than any man," for it was not only the physical wounds He endured for our salvation but the spiritual as well. He "sprinkled" many nations with His cleansing blood. We are reminded of the great sorrow and grief Jesus bore for us and our salvation.

### THE PASSION LESSON: In the Upper Room

In this portion of the record of events occurring during the Last Passover Supper, we learn of the depth of Jesus' humility and cleansing power. He came as one to serve and willing washed His disciples' feet. We all need to be washed by the Lord, for He alone washes our sins away. Replacing the Passover which was fulfilled in Christ, Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper as a special meal imparting the grace of His forgiveness and cleansing in the reception of His true body and blood in the bread and wine.
