

THE EPISTLE LESSON: Hebrews 9:16-28

For God's covenant of salvation to be fulfilled it was necessary that the One who prepared this will and testament should die. God reveals through the Old Testament sacrifices that the shedding of blood was necessary for purification from sin and its stain. Without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sin. Jesus' sacrifice was a far better sacrifice, so that repeated sacrifices for sin are no longer necessary. Jesus has put away sin with His sacrifice. He offered Himself once for all people, for all sin, for all time.

THE PASSION LESSON: Jesus Trial before Herod and Pilate Neither Herod nor Pilate found any guilt in Jesus. Pilate hoped the Jews would chose Jesus for the Passover pardon, but Barabbas, a murderer, was set free while Jesus was condemned. Pilate had Jesus scourged, and then Pilate appealed to the people for mercy, but they cried, "Crucify, Crucify!" They finally declared they wanted Jesus put to death for saying that He was the Son of God. And there is the truth that saves us. The Son of God had to die for our transgressions.
