

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Genesis 28:10-22

Jacob, in his greed for the greater material blessing, had deceived his father and betrayed his brother. Alone and on the run for his life Jacob came to a place he would call Bethel or the house of God. There God revealed to Jacob the Ladder to heaven that was to come from Jacob's special Descendant, or Seed. God blessed Jacob, not because of Jacob's desire or Jacob's merit, but because of God's grace. So the blessing of the Promised Seed was transferred to Jacob, and the Lord was with him.
