

<u>CLC NEWS</u>: The Rev. Luke Bernthal, pastor of Grace Lutheran, Valentine NE, Peace Lutheran, Mission, and St. Paul's Lutheran, White River SD, has returned the call to Faith Lutheran, Markesan WI. The Rev. Joel Fleischer, pastor of Berea Lutheran, Sioux Falls SD, has returned the call to Rock of Ages Lutheran, Grand Rapids MI.

Immanuel Begins: This past Monday the academic year began at Immanuel Lutheran in Eau Claire, WI. High school enrollment begins with 109 total students (30 freshmen, 26 sophomores, 24 juniors, and 29 seniors). We rejoice that this enrollment matches the number of full-time students we had last year and is an increase of five students from what

was anticipated. In the college there are 20 total students, five of these are taking courses online. At this time nine students are pursuing the teaching ministry and six are preparing for seminary training. While seminary will begin later, five students are expected for the year. We thank the Lord for all those blood-bought souls that will be immersed in His Word during their Immanuel experience.

Comments on the first month of the new fiscal year:

- The General Fund offerings were \$60,917 which was \$14,083 short of budget
- General Fund expenditures were over budget because of larger than normal
 - Missions expenditures
- July ILC operations receipts are normally low pending the start of the fall semester
- MDF expenditures included \$4,216 for foreign Exploratory/Outreach
- IIF expenditures included \$6,838 for professorage repairs
- A \$40,000 special gift was received for the ILC Building account
- The Reserve Account incorrectly reported a disbursement of \$7,395 at the end of June to cover an FY16 deficit. The \$26,415 receipt is a corrected result of the Fy16 year-end totals.
