<u>THE RESPONSIVE INTROIT</u>: (Psalm 56:1,3,4,10,11) Be merciful to me, O God, for man would swallow me up; **Fighting all day he oppresses me**. ³ Whenever I am afraid, **I will trust in You**. ⁴ In God (I will praise His word), In God I have put my trust; **I will not fear. What can flesh do to me?** ¹⁰ In God (I will praise *His* word), **In the Lord (I will praise** *His* word), ¹¹ In God I have put my trust; I will not be afraid. **What can man do to me?** *Glory be to the Father...*

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Jeremiah 20:7-13

Jeremiah expresses the conflict within the child of God whose heart is filled with joy at the message of repentance and salvation God has given us to share with the world. At the same time our sinful flesh shies away from the derision that one might receive from friends and acquaintances; persecution which could easily go beyond words. But then Jeremiah remembers that the Lord is mighty to save and has delivered us from the evildoers.
