<u>CLC NEWS</u>: Missionary Todd Olhmann was recently in a bicycle accident resulting in a fractured c3 vertebrae in his neck. A fracture to this vertebrae is very serious and could cause paralysis and even death. Thankfully, the Lord has preserved Todd from either of these. He will need to wear a neck brace and be under some strong movement restrictions for at least a month while they watch the fracture and make sure that it heals. He had a trip to Zambia planned this month, and that will need to be rescheduled.

Partners in Ministry Program: The 2016 CLC Convention approved the Partners in Ministry Program which is designed to link active CLC called servants who have obligations to repay ILC Student Aid Fund loans with sponsors who agree to provide matching funds for payments on those loans. The donor and recipient would remain anonymous to each other. This program is now ready for implementation. There are about a dozen eligible account holders who will be contacted directly to see if they are interested in participating and would then need to fill out an application annually. 500th ANNIVERSARY OF THE REFORMATION GEMS FROM LUTHER

(Regarding the Lord's Supper)

"The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? (1 Corinthians 10:16 NKJV)

"This passage was a reviving tonic to my heart in my trials concerning this Sacrament; and if we had no more passages than this one, we could nonetheless sufficiently confirm all consciences with it and forcefully enough refute all adversaries. ... Plainly and clearly St. Paul states: The very bread which we break is the communion of the body of Christ. Do you hear, my brother? The broken bread, or the bread distributed in pieces, is the communion of the body of Christ. It is, it is, it is, says he, the communion of the body of Christ? It can consist in nothing else than this, that they who individually take a piece of

the broken bread receive in it the body of Christ." (What Luther Says Volume II p. 797, Ewald Plass Concordia Publishing House c.1959)
