THE EPISTLE LESSON: Philippians 1:3-5, 18b-27

Paul rejoices in the fellowship of faith which he has with the Philippians. It is a fellowship in the grace of God so that Paul is confident and ready for however his imprisonment might end. His death would mean Paul would be with Christ all the sooner; Paul's release would mean he will have opportunity to continue to work in the Lord's fields for the good and blessing of his fellow Christians. And so God's grace predominates in our lives also. May the conduct of our lives reflect that grace to others.

THE GOSPEL LESSON: Mathew 20:1-16

This parable reveals the difference in thinking between the Lord and men. We naturally think we ought to be rewarded according to our work. That is not the Lord's way. When we are called to faith we are called to a purpose, to live and work for the Lord. If that be for our entire lives we are blessed and rewarded according to grace. If that be but our last hour, we are blessed and rewarded according to grace.

500th ANNIVERSARY OF THE REFORMATION GEMS FROM MARTIN LUTHER

(concerning Prayer)

"Praying is the work of faith alone and something no one but Christians can do. For Christians do not base their prayer on themselves but on the name of the Son of God, in whose name they have been baptized; and they are certain that praying in this way is pleasing to God because He has told us to pray in the name of Christ and has promised to hear us. Others, who undertake to pray in their own name, do not know this. ... This is not the mind of a Christian after prayer. ... He finds in reality that God helps him in all troubles; and although he is not at once freed from his plight, he nevertheless knows that his prayer is pleasing and is heard. And God grants him the ability to bear and overcome what is troubling him. This amounts to having the trouble taken from him; for once it is overcome, it is no longer a misfortune."
