<u>THE RESPONSIVE INTROIT</u>: (Psalm 147:1-6 NKJV) Praise the Lord! For *it is* good to sing praises to our God; **For** *it is* **pleasant,** *and* **praise is beautiful.** ² The Lord builds up Jerusalem; **He gathers together the outcasts of Israel.** ³ He heals the brokenhearted **And binds up their wounds.** ⁴ He counts the number of the stars; **He calls them all by name.** ⁵ Great *is* our Lord, and mighty in power; **His understanding** *is* **infinite.** ⁶ The Lord lifts up the humble; **He casts the wicked down to the ground.** *Glory be to the Father...*

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Ezekiel 18:1-4, 25-32

The people of Israel accused the Lord of being unfair and bringing a judgment upon them which they didn't deserve. The Lord made it clear children would not die for the sins of their fathers, neither would fathers die for the sins of their children. "The soul that sins shall die." The Lord pleaded with Israel to repent. He has no pleasure in the death of the wicked. And so yet today the gospel goes forth calling sinners to life and salvation.

THE GOSPEL LESSON: Mathew 21:28-32

The obedience of faith is not a matter of saying the right words, but putting faith into action. In Jesus' parable the son who repented and obeyed was the one who did the will of his father. So also we who have been disobedient need to repent and believe the gospel. Sinners, like us, shall enter into the kingdom of Gods by the righteousness of faith.

500th ANNIVERSARY OF THE REFORMATION GEMS FROM MARTIN LUTHER (concerning Humility)

"In the world inequality of persons, ranks, and gifts must remain; but this does not make us unequal before our Lord God. For since nothing can stand before Him except grace, no one can possibly boast and strut in His presence ... All of us should learn this and cling to His grace and mercy ... What we have, we have from Him alone; and of ourselves we have nothing but sin. Therefore no one should become overbearing, but everyone should humble himself and fear. For if there is good, it is the gift of our Lord God. He should boast of it, not you. But you should use it with thanksgiving and in the fear of God; for He cannot tolerate any strutting, any boasting, or bragging." (What Luther Says; Vol II #2091, Concordia Publishing House)
