THE EPISTLE LESSON: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

We need to keep the hope of the resurrection before us always. There is no other reason. My sin and death hung about His neck on Good Friday, but on the day of Easter they had completely disappeared. This victory He has bestowed on me. This is why I do not worry about you."
