## THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Isaiah 52:13-53:6

In His sufferings for us Jesus' appearance was marred more than others, more than the sons of men. Of course the physical brutality contributed to this, but so also did the condemnation of God which accounted for the depth of His sufferings. "He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God and afflicted."

### THE PASSION LESSON: Jesus is Crucified

Even as Jesus, in tremendous pain and torment, was being led away to Calvary, His heart went out to the people of Jerusalem, because of the unnecessary judgment that would befall them. At Golgotha they crucified Jesus between the two criminals. The placard declaring Jesus' cause for execution testified to the truth: He is King, also **our** King!

### THE DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

The most wondrous assurance of His peace that God brings us is found in His coming to us in a visible way. Our Lord Jesus tells us that His body, the very body sacrificed on the cross for our sins, and His blood, the same blood that was shed for the remission of our sins, is literally present as we eat of the bread and drink of the wine in the Lord's Supper. As penitent sinners receive His body and blood we also receive His personal assurance that He abides with us in peace. It is therefore important that communicants be able to examine themselves and repent of their sins before receiving the sacrament.
