Notes: (June is the end of Fiscal Year 2018)

- * General Fund offerings in June totaled \$86,320 vs disbursements of \$74,984, resulting in an accrued negative balance of \$-4,676 for FY18. However, \$84,613 was returned to the General Fund Reserve by the Boards of Education, Trustees, Regents, and Missions from their unused subsidy for the year, which resets their starting balances to \$0 for the new Fiscal Year 2019. The resulting Reserve account balance (less investment capital losses of \$2,486) is \$307,317.
- * ILC Building Projects offerings in June totaled \$5,395 vs the monthly mortgage payment of \$8,000, resulting in a year end balance of \$15,500. As previously reported, an extra payment of \$80,000 on principal was made this Spring, which has saved total interest of \$115,000 on the AC/North Hall loan & decreased the loan term by 2 years.
- * CEF: revenue in June totaled \$44,425 from congregations' CEF loan repayments, which was partially offset by investment capital losses of -\$15,664 in the Investment Pool for the last quarter. The Pool valuation reported on 6/30/18 was \$1,662,855.
- * MDF: offerings in June totaled \$11,437 vs disbursements of \$21,666, leaving a balance of \$55,340.
- * SAF: received \$11,777 in June from congregational offerings (\$1,682) and student loan re-payments (\$10,094) vs disbursements of \$1,855, resulting in a FY18 year end balance of \$77,286.
- * IIF: The ILC Improvement Fund June offering was \$668 vs \$83,508 disbursements (\$78,000 for Ingram Drive paving, \$5100 for Athletic Field Storage Building), resulting in an IIF balance of \$108,123. The Ingram Drive paving & lighting was completed June 8 at an estimated cost of \$92,000. The field house heating upgrade and several professorage repairs/upgrades remain to be completed this summer.
