THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Amos 5:6,7, 10-15

The children of God must be careful not to fall into the abusive ways of the world. Too often the poor, or the righteous are oppressed by the those with power and influence. There are occasions for "the prudent to keep silent at that time for it is an evil time," and for the child of God to "seek good and not evil" ... "So the LORD God of hosts will be with you."

THE GOSPEL LESSON: Mark 10:17-27

It all comes down to the "why." The rich young man desired to do what he needed to do to inherit the kingdom of God. His "why for keeping the commandments was to earn salvation. He loved his wealth more than he loved God or his neighbor. When one's treasure is in heaven and we know that we are saved by grace through faith, then the why for keeping the commandments is to glorify God and bless our neighbor.

<u>CLC NEWS</u>: Dr. Daniel Schierenbeck, member at Living Word in Blue Springs, MO, has accepted the call to serve as Professor at Immanuel Lutheran College in Eau Claire, WI. Dr. Schierenbeck is a Professor of English at the University of Central Missouri, also serving as the English department head. He is a former graduate of Immanuel, from the High School and from the College with a Pre-Theology degree, and also has a PhD in English from the University of Tennessee. (This call is to replace Prof. Paul Schaller who is retiring at the end of June 2019.)

New Devotion Book: Pastor Mark Weis, a CLC pastor serving in Lemmon, SD, has a unique and wonderful ability to express Biblical encouragement and teachings in writing. He recently published a new devotional book called, "One Thing Needful, Volume 2." This volume has devotions which fall into four categories: general devotions, along with devotions on the seven letters to the seven churches of Revelation, the seven 'words' Jesus spoke from the cross, and the seven petitions of the Lord's Prayer.
