### THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Isaiah 53:4-9

"He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows." (v.4) "He was wounded for our transgressions." (v.5) "He was led as a lamb to the slaughter." # THE PASSION HISTORY LESSON: "Trial before Pilate II" Pilate marveled not only at the number of false accusations

leveled against Jesus but Jesus' silence in facing all these accusations. Neither Pilate nor Herod found any fault in Jesus,

but it was Barabbas the murderer who was set free, while Jesus was bound for punishment. And so "the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all." (Isaiah. 53:6).
