

SERMON TEXT: Numbers 21:4-9

Then they journeyed from Mount Hor by the Way of the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; and the soul of the people became very discouraged on the way. ⁵ And the people spoke against God and against Moses: "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For *there is* no food and no water, and our soul loathes this worthless bread." ⁶ So the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people; and many of the people of Israel died. ⁷ Therefore the people came to Moses, and said, "We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD and against you; pray to the Lord that He take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. ⁸ Then the LORD said to Moses, "Make a fiery *serpent*, and set it on a pole; and it shall be that everyone who is bitten, when he looks at it, shall live." ⁹ So Moses made a bronze serpent, and put it on a pole; and so it was, if a serpent had bitten anyone, when he looked at the bronze serpent, he lived. General Fund – February offerings of \$65,295 vs disbursements of \$75,327, resulted in a net shortfall for the month of \$10,031, and increased the General Fund deficit to -\$37,273. Offerings to date are falling short of our CBP estimated revenue needs by \$77,862, but General Fund disbursements are \$40,589 less than estimated expenses, partly due to our boards' efforts to hold down expenses. We share the confidence of David: "I have been young and now am old, yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor His seed begging bread." (Ps 37:25) The Lord always provides for His people!

- **ILC Operations** February revenue of \$112,933 (incl \$49,500 subsidy) vs disbursements of \$111,105; 8 months through the fiscal year, disbursements are \$67,000 below YTD estimated needs.
- **ILC Building Projects** February offerings of \$435 vs disbursements of \$567 for the Building Planning Committee expenses. Earnings (dividends/interest) for 8 months are \$52,548. The Committee is preparing a recommendation for the June 24 CLC Convention for a new gym and repurposing ILC's 50-year-old gym for ILC/CLC gatherings: Musicals, Graduation, Conventions, etc.
- **CEF** February revenue of \$24,331 (congregation monthly loan payments) vs disbursements of \$251,500 (\$96,850 for 5 individual CEF Notes paid off, \$21,900 semi-annual Note interest paid, and \$132,750 for Grace, Sleepy Eye CEF loan to purchase a teacherage. Two other congregations plan to submit loan applications soon. The Trustees 20-year mortgage (\$131,300) on the Claymore Lane professorage was paid off in February.
- **MDF** February offerings of \$18,399 vs disbursements of \$11,622, which includes the 9th \$10,000 construction grant (of 12 planned) for the Nepal Bible Institute classroom building and quarters.
- **SAF** Feb receipts of \$9,771 vs disbursals of \$8,933 for student loans & grants. The <u>SAF</u> Endowment Account earnings (Div & Int) for 8 mo YTD are \$27,045 on an endowment portfolio of \$1,438,942.
- **ILC PMPG** Public Ministry Prep Grants: YTD receipts of \$38,836 vs a grant of \$32,400 to 9 teacher & 6 pastor students this school year, preparing to be CLC teachers & pastors. The PMP

Endowment investments of \$1.7 million has provided earnings of \$33,244 to the PMPG for FY21 year to date.

Kinship – Congregation offerings of \$22,353 vs disbursements of \$599 (Admin, Students, Widows). James E. Sandeen, CLC Treasurer Thomas J. Lentz, Chairman, CLC Board of Trustees
