#### HYMN 398: Renew Me, O Eternal Light

#### THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Amos 5:6,7,10-15 <sup>6</sup> Seek the LORD and live, Lest He break out like fire *in* the house of Joseph, And devour *it*, With no one to quench *it* in Bethel— <sup>7</sup> You who turn justice to wormwood, And lay righteousness to rest in the earth!" <sup>10</sup> They hate the one who rebukes in the gate, And they abhor the one who speaks uprightly.

<sup>11</sup>Therefore, because you tread down the poor And take grain taxes from him, Though you have built houses of hewn stone, Yet you shall not dwell in them; You have planted pleasant vineyards, But you shall not drink wine from them. <sup>12</sup> For I know your manifold transgressions And your mighty sins: Afflicting the just *and* taking bribes: Diverting the poor *from justice* at the gate. <sup>13</sup>Therefore the prudent keep silent at that time, For it *is* an evil time. <sup>14</sup>Seek good and not evil, That you may live; So the LORD God of hosts will be with you, As you have spoken. <sup>15</sup>Hate evil, love good; Establish justice in the gate. It may be that the LORD God of hosts Will be gracious to the remnant of Joseph. (NKJV)

#### THE GOSPEL LESSON: : Mark 10:17-27

<sup>17</sup> Now as He was going out on the road, one came running, knelt before Him, and asked Him, "Good Teacher, what shall I do that I may inherit eternal life?"

<sup>18</sup> So Jesus said to him, "Why do you call Me good? No one *is* good but One, *that is*, God. <sup>19</sup> You know the commandments: 'Do not commit adultery,' 'Do not murder,' 'Do not steal,' 'Do not bear false witness,' 'Do not defraud,' 'Honor your father and your mother.' "

<sup>20</sup> And he answered and said to Him, "Teacher, all these things I have kept from my youth."

<sup>21</sup> Then Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "One thing you lack: Go your way, sell whatever you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, take up the cross, and follow Me."

<sup>22</sup>But he was sad at this word, and went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions.

<sup>23</sup> Then Jesus looked around and said to His disciples, "How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!" <sup>24</sup> And the disciples were astonished at His words. But Jesus answered again and said to them, "Children, how hard it is for those who trust in riches to enter the kingdom of God! <sup>25</sup> It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God."

<sup>26</sup> And they were greatly astonished, saying among themselves, "Who then can be saved?"

<sup>27</sup> But Jesus looked at them and said, "With men *it is* impossible, but not with God; for with God all things are possible." (NKJV)

#### SERMON TEXT Hebrews 3:1-6

Therefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, Christ Jesus, <sup>2</sup> who was faithful to Him who appointed Him, as Moses also *was faithful* in all His house. <sup>3</sup> For this One has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses, inasmuch as He who built the house has more honor than the house. <sup>4</sup> For every house is built by someone, but He who built all things *is* God. <sup>5</sup> And Moses indeed *was* faithful in all His house as a servant, for a testimony of those things which would be spoken *afterward*. but Christ as a Son over His own house, whose house we are if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm to the end (NKJV)
